


Rupee is Pakistan's Currency. One (01) US dollar is currently equivalent to 280 rupees in open market.

INTERNATIONAL ISLAMIC UNIVERSITY, ISLAMABAD



International Islamic University, Islamabad is an international seat of Islamic learning in Pakistan, which provides every opportunity for an all-round and harmonious development of individuals and society and reconstruction of human thought on Islamic foundation.

The foundation of the University was laid on the first day of the 15th Hijrah Century, Muharram 1, 1401 (November 11, 1980). This landmark of the beginning of the new century symbolizes the aspirations and hopes of the Muslim Ummah for an Islamic renaissance. The desire to produce scholars and practitioners, imbued with Islamic learning, character and personality, and capable to meet the economic, social, political, and intellectual needs of modern times is the aim of this University.

The University started as "Islamic University" with only 9 students in its LL.M degree Program and classes being held at the Campus of Quaid-i-Azam University, Islamabad. The University was upgraded, restructured and reconstituted as "International Islamic University" with the promulgation of the International Islamic University Ordinance by the President of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan in March, 1985.

Presently, the University has Forty (40) departments Eleven (11) different faculties and Six (6) autonomous academies, institutes of higher learning. The University is conducting around One Hundred Fifty Nine (159) academic programs with enrollment of over 30,000 students include around 15,000 female students. In addition around 1,500 students are enrolled at Iqra College of Technology (ICT), a constituent unit of the University.




FEMALE CAMPUS

LOCATION

FACULTY OF ENGINEERING & TECHNOLOGY

The Faculty of Engineering and Technology (FET) was established in year 2007 with Department of Electrical Engineering as its first constituent department. The Department of Electrical Engineering already existed in the university under the Faculty of Applied Sciences. The foundation stone of an independent building block, namely Engineering Block was laid in April 2007 which is inaugurated in July 2009. The present Electrical Engineering Department is one of the largest departments within the University with thriving undergraduate and postgraduate students. Mechanical Engineering Department and Civil Engineering Department were established in 2010 and 2014, respectively. 



FUNCTIONS OF QUALITY ASSURANCE AND DEVELOPMENT (QAD)

Quality Assurance and Development was established in IIU in Feb 2010 under the guidance of Higher Education Commission (HEC) Islamabad in its 3rd Phase for improving quality of education offered at IIU for competing other National and International Educational Institutes. Basic functions of QAD advised by HEC are as under: -

1. QAD is to be headed Director whose power will be reporting directly to President/Rector/Vice Chancellor. He is to be the correspondent with the outside bodies.
2. QAD is responsible for promoting public confidence that the quality and standards of the award of degrees are enhanced and safeguarded.
3. QAD is responsible for the review of quality standards and the quality of teaching and learning in each subject area.
4. QAD is responsible for the review of academic affiliations with other institutions in terms of effective management of standards and quality of programs.
5. QAD is responsible for defining clear and explicit standards as points of reference to the reviews to be carried out. It should also help the employees to know as to what they could expect from candidates.
6. QAD is responsible to develop qualifications framework by setting out the attributes and abilities that can be expected from the holder of a qualification, i.e. Bachelors, Bachelor with Honors, Master's, MS/M.Phil and Doctoral.
7. QAD is responsible to develop program specifications. These are standard set of information clarifying what knowledge, understanding, skills and other attributes a student will have developed on successfully completing a specific program.
8. QAD is responsible to develop quality assurance processes and methods of evaluation to affirm that the quality of provision and the standard of awards are being maintained and to foster curriculum, subject and staff development, together with research and other scholarly activities.
9. QAD is responsible to ensure that the university's quality assurance procedures are designed to fit in with the arrangements in place nationally for maintaining and improving the quality of Higher Education.

PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES CLINIC (PSC)

Psychological Services Clinic has been established for Faculty members, Staff and Students of International Islamic University Islamabad. Clinic operates under the auspices of Department of Psychology of International Islamic University Islamabad. Organizational body of PSC consists of licensed Clinicians of Clinical and Testing Psychology of PhD and doctoral/MS Level. The primary purpose of Clinic is to provide a maximum Psychological support to the students and PhD Scholars of IIUI particularly for stress management during their research work and dissertation writing.

The Psychological Services Clinic provides a range of individual therapies. It is a community-based outpatient facility program that provides a variety of psychological services (assessment, consultation, and individual therapy) under the close supervision of the clinical faculty members called clinical supervisors and psychologists. PSC also provides the opportunity for Clinical students to gain experience in treating clients under a managed-care model.

PSC also offers the Psychological assessments and Psychological testing's for the Psychological/ Neuropsychological disorders and the educational matters like Intelligence, Memory and Personality by using the scientific tests, self report inventories and other rating scales.

PSYCHOTHERAPY

After comprehensive assessment PSC provides services which include psychotherapy (Evidence based e.g. BPT) in general for those having psychiatric / psychological problems and CBT (Cognitive Behavioural Therapy) for selected patients, specifically having Depression, Anxiety, Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD), Eating disorder, Adjustment and Emotional Problems for young people, Addiction and Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, Memory Disorder and Community Reinforcement Approach (CRA) for all clients having Alcohol and Addiction problems.

RESEARCH

PSC under the auspices of Department of Psychology actively participates in research and scientific activities, conducting research on vital issues, reviewing literature and published articles.

CLINICAL SUPERVISION

Supervision provides an opportunity for the student to capture the essence of the psychotherapeutic process as it is articulated and modeled by the supervisor, and to recreate it in the counseling relationship or Supervision is that part of the overall training of mental health professionals that deals with modifying their actual in-therapy behaviors.

Department of Psychology provides a comprehensive and evidence based clinical psychology program at BS and MS level. For this purpose the department has formed a core team to cater clinical supervision in line with the International best practices. Following are the key members of this team.





RESULT AWAITING CANDIDATES**(FOR UNDERGRADUATE ONLY):**

Applicants awaiting results (only those who have already appeared in the exams) can also apply for admission and if they pass the entry test they shall be given provisional admission until declaration of their respective results. Such candidates are required to fill in the undertaking that he/she will submit result within one month time after commencement of semester, failing which his/her admissions shall stand cancelled without any further notice. And if he/she fails to secure required



marks or CGPA, his / her admission shall be treated as cancelled immediately without any further notice and continuation of studies shall be considered Unlawful. Applicants securing straight passing marks/grades with required percentage only shall be eligible for continuation of studies.

NOTE: The absolute value of percentage is considered as final; it is not rounded off to next whole number e.g. 49.99% is considered 49.99% and NOT 50%. Similarly 2.49/4.00 means 2.49/4.00 and NOT 2.50/4.00.

ADMISSION TEST

Admissions are granted to the candidates (except overseas) on the basis of written test and interview as per details/schedule announced by the University. The admission test focuses on language skills in Arabic/English language, subject aptitude and general analytical skills on the pattern of TOEFL, GMAT and SAT. The weight-age for admission test / interview and previous qualification is given below:

GUIDELINES FOR OVERSEAS CANDIDATES

OVERSEAS CANDIDATES: (EXPATRIATE PAKISTANI & FOREIGNERS)

1. Candidates coming from Cambridge system ("O" and "A" levels), may be considered for exemption in non-credit English language courses but should appear in level test for Arabic language at the Arabic Language Teaching Unit of Faculty of Arabic, for determination of their placement to the appropriate level of Arabic language (Elementary, Intermediate or Advanced) before getting registered to regular courses in their respective faculties. This policy shall apply in both undergraduate and graduate degree programs.
2. If a candidate is deficient in Arabic or English languages, he/she will study the required language(s) in the ALT / ELT Units of the University and shall have acquired the required standard of proficiency before being allowed to join the undergraduate or graduate programs.
3. Candidates holding a Higher Secondary School Certificate or a Bachelor's Degree from Arab countries/Arabic speaking countries shall be exempted in Arabic language. He / She will, however, be required to study English language in the Faculty of Languages & Literature before being allowed to join regular program of study i.e. undergraduate or graduate.
4. Overseas applicants are exempted from admission test, except Afghan refugees. They are granted admission on the basis of previous qualification, equivalent to the required eligibility criteria for the program, they are applying for admission.
5. No admission is allowed on paper qualification basis to Faculty of Engineering & Technology according to the policy of Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC).
6. No admission is allowed on the basis of paper qualification to the result awaiting overseas candidates. They have to appear for entry test to be conducted by the faculty as per schedule.
7. Equivalence of foreign certificates / degree(s) to be obtained from Inter Board Committee of Chairman, Islamabad (IBCC) and Higher Education Commission Pakistan (HEC), must be submitted within a time span of one semester after joining the university.
8. Admission to Overseas / Foreigner students is offered in one (01) degree program and it is not allowed to switch-over to any other degree program after joining IIUI. For change in degree program, the candidate is required to apply afresh from the country of his / her origin after completion of requisite procedure.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE Guide Lines for Foreigner / Overseas Pakistani Candidates

Overseas candidate has to apply for admission directly to IIUI, through its Online Application Form or prescribed application form available on website www.iiu.edu.pk. No admission shall be accepted / entertained through any representative / third party.

1. CHECK LIST:

Following documents are required to be uploaded / attached with admission application form:

- Application processing fee (Non-refundable) amounting to \$75/= and attach copy of deposit slip / challan or Bank Draft or Pay Order with application form favoring IIU Islamabad.
- Copies of all verified documents must be attached/uploaded with application form.



- Passport size Photographs with blue background.
- Copy of Passport Residential Permit (Iqama), Overseas ID card, NOC from Ministry of Foreign Affairs or Your Embassy in Pakistan. Incase of below the age of 18 years copy of Child Registration Form, (B-Form) of the candidate.
- Three copies of duly filled government of Pakistani Permission form (Students' Information Sheet) available at IIUI website.
- Undertaking for Admission on Paper Qualification (available at IIUI website: www.iiu.edu.pk).

2. Admission shall be granted to all foreigners / Overseas Pakistani candidates on the basis of paper qualification in all faculties except Faculty of Engineering & Technology (FET) after fulfillment of the following requirements:

- Verified Educational documents (all degree / certificates)
- Valid Passport & Valid Study Visa.
- No Objection Certificate (NOC) from their Ministry of Foreign Affairs or their Embassy in Pakistan.
- In case of Overseas Pakistani, Residential Permit (Iqama), Overseas ID Card or B-form.

3. After confirmation of admission, the case(s) of the foreigner candidates(s) shall be forwarded to Higher Education Commission (HEC) Islamabad along with their passport copy, photographs, admission letter, NOC from their Embassy or Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Student's Information Sheet for Issuance of No Objection Certificate (NOC).

4. The applicant should immediately apply for study visa to Pakistan Embassy/Mission in their home country. They may not travel to Pakistan without obtaining valid study visa, as no student is allowed to join the University without proper study visa.

5. Foreign Diplomats and Multiple visa holders present in Pakistan: In case a foreign Diplomat or Multiple Visa holder present in Pakistan gets admission in IIUI, shall be required to obtain No Objection Certificate (NOC) from Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Govt. of Pakistan for study purpose before joining.

6. After joining, all the foreign/Overseas Pakistani students shall be referred to relevant language proficiency test to be conducted by Arabic Language Teaching Unit and English Language Teaching Unit. The student shall be placed in the language class for Language improvement (if required). No student shall be allowed to register the regular courses of semester before passing the language level test.

7. Admission to Afghan National (Refugees) candidates shall be granted only on the basis of Test/Interviews.

8. All foreigners/Overseas Pakistani students shall bound to obtain proper equivalence of their foreign educational certificates/degree from Inter-board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC) Islamabad and Higher Education Commission (HEC) Islamabad with the required percentage of marks/CGPA, and submit to Overseas Admissions Office within six months after joining the University. In case of failure they will not be allowed to continue their study without the required equivalence until they obtain it.

9. After confirmation of their admissions / joining, the Provost concerned shall ensure the hostel seats before or at the time of joining so that the candidates directly move to their hostel's room easily.

10. Admission to Foreigners/Overseas Pakistani is offered in one degree program and it is not allowed to switch-over to any other degree program after joining the University.

11. Admission cases of male and female candidates shall be dealt by Admission Office Male and Admission Office female separately.

GRANT OF ADMISSION AND VISA FORMALITIES:

1. IIUI issues admission offer letter to successful candidate and copy of the same is sent to the Higher Education Commission (HEC), Pakistan along with Student Information Sheet, copy of candidate's Passport, NOC of their Ministry of Foreign Affairs or Embassy. HEC coordinates all approvals/verification for the student's visa requirement.
2. After completion of requirements, Ministry of Interior Govt. of Pakistan sends visa advice to Pakistani Embassy/High Commission of the country of student's origin for issuance of study visa to the applicant.
3. Student(s) approaches Pakistani Embassy/High Commission at his country of origin for grant of study visa along with following documents:
 - Visa Application Form (available at the Ministry of Interior Website)
 - Photocopy of Passport
 - Photographs
 - Educational Documents
 - Copy of Admission letter of the University
4. Student visa is issued by Pakistani Embassy/High Commission after fulfillment of all requirements for period of one year to be renewed / extended annually on the basis of security clearance.

Extension in visa is granted by the Ministry of Interior, Govt. of Pakistan on production of following documents:

- Visa Extension form.
- Bona-fide Student Certificate to be issued by IIUI in due course.
- NOC of Higher Education Commission (HEC) and NOC from their Embassy.
- Photographs.

5. The student directly approaches to the concerned authorized passport office of the region along with above listed documents for extension in visa.
6. Intimation regarding any student leaving IIUI or not remaining a full-time student of IIUI is immediately reported to HEC for onward submission to Ministry of Interior, Govt. of Pakistan for necessary action.

NOTE: Rules and regulations are subject to revision from time to time as and when required by the university authority.



GENERAL ACADEMIC RULES

PAYMENT OF FEE:

Candidates are required to pay the prescribed fee for the program, before the due date. Last date may be seen on admission letters or as announced by the Faculty. Partial payments are not accepted. Candidates failing to deposit full fee by the due date shall lose their seats, which will be offered to the next candidates on the merit list.

NUMBER OF SEATS:

Admission Committees of the Faculties determine the number of candidates to be offered admission on the basis of available seats and the minimum acceptable score. List of Selected Candidates is displayed on the university website and faculty notice board. Results should not be enquired on telephone.

ACADEMIC SYSTEM:

Academic system of the University is based on semester system. Two regular semesters are offered every year i.e. Fall Semester (September-January), Spring Semester (February-June). Each semester essentially maintains 48 teaching hours for a course of 3 credit hours. A student generally registers in courses offered by each Faculty in every semester as per scheme of study.

ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT:

All students shall be required to maintain an attendance of at least 75% in each course taken in a semester. There shall be no relaxation on any ground (including medical and other emergencies) to the minimum required attendance. A student not attaining at least 75% attendance in any of the course(s) shall be prevented from appearing in the terminal examination and shall be treated fail in the course(s) and all the grades/marks obtained in that course(s) during the semester shall stand cancelled.

ACADEMIC STRUCTURE FOR BS PROGRAM:

In all the Faculties total Credit hours are 132-136 for BS program out of which 60% Weight-age is given to the major subjects of the degree and 40% weight-age is given to the general subjects (for example students of Islamic Studies will study 40% of the credit hours from Social Sciences, Humanities and Natural Sciences and 60% of the credit hours from Major subjects) and likewise in other subjects. Minimum duration of BS program is 4 years i.e., 8 regular semesters within CGPA range of 2.00/4.00 and passing of Hifz Test.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTIONS:

Arabic and English are the medium of instructions in the University. Arabic is the primary medium of instruction in the Faculties of Usuluddin (Islamic Studies), Arabic and Shariah & Law. Ability to read, write and comprehend English is also required. Whereas in all other faculties (Except Urdu and Persian Departments), English is the medium of instruction. Applicants for admission at IIU are required to pass Language Proficiency Test to qualify for admissions. The University runs a program for improvement in Arabic and English Proficiency in ALT and ELT Units for students.

Students applying for Faculty of Usuluddin (Islamic Studies) and Faculty of Shariah & Law will appear in Level test for Arabic and English, after determination of Level, admission will be given provisionally in Language program first. Regular Program will only be allowed to start after qualifying language level test.

EXAMINATIONS & EVALUATION SYSTEM:

Besides, quizzes, presentations and class participation the students are assessed on the basis of marks obtained in mid-term exams which are held after about 8 weeks of study in a semester and terminal exams which are held after 16 weeks of study.

**GRADING SCHEME:**

The Letter Grades and Grade Points for a course are determined on the basis of the marks obtained by the student in the final examination and the semester work in the following manner (w.e.f. Fall Semester, 2010). Only for newly admitted students.

In case a student secures less than minimum required CGPA in the first semester, he / she is declared ceased immediately and no further chance is given to continue studies.

POLICY FOR HYBRID TEACHING AND LEARNING

The Policy on the subject matter is as recommended by the Academic council is as under:-

- i. The policy shall be named as IIUI policy for hybrid teaching and learning
- ii. The university on special cases may give an option of online mode of study at

BS level with following conditions:

- a. LMS/Google class room along with necessary protocols as applied during COIVID-19 era shall be followed.
- b. The policy shall be applied on those students who requires maximum 02 semesters to complete their degree.
- c. Request of the student shall be evaluated by a committee comprising of Dean of the faculty, HOD and a senior faculty member of the department. The committee shall recommend the case (s) on following grounds:-

 - i. Such overseas students who are unable to attend face to face mode of study owing to visa restrictions.
 - ii. The tenure of the student or his family at the embassy/high commission has expired and no further extension permissible.
 - iii. In land students who stuck in their home town owing to the reason beyond their control such as law and order situation, natural calamity, medical reasons etc.

- d. The request of such students duly recommended by the committee shall be submitted to the Vice President (Academics) through the office of Director (A&E) for approval.
- e. The committee consisting of Dean, HOD and a senior faculty member shall ensure quality of teaching and learning through hybrid mode of study.
- f. The transcript of such students shall indicate the mode of hybrid teaching and learning for these particular semesters.
- g. Double course fee shall be charged from the student.
- h. The teacher shall be compensated through additional payment of 100% course fee to be received from the student with no liability on the part of the university.
- i. New section shall be created in case of more than 10 students registered in this mode of study in a particular course.
- j. The President IIUI shall be authority to relax double payment of fee in case of needy students.
- k. Attendance requirement shall be as per rules of the university.



- I. Such students would have to complete the courses within Degree duration prescribed by the university and HEC.
- m. The assigned faculty member shall ensure to resolve the queries of the students in respect of assignments, quizzes & lecture material etc.

STUDENTS DISCIPLINE COMMITTEE (SDC)

The Students Discipline Committee (SDC) is a statutory committee comprised of senior Faculty Members not below the rank of Professor and Associate Professor to deal with the matters of indiscipline, breach of university's code of conduct and all such acts derogatory to Islamic moral values, within the University. The Director (Academics & Examinations), IIU is the Secretary and In-Charge Female Campus is the ex-officio Member of the Committee. The Committee by taking actions as per notified Regulations; ensures a conductive and peaceful environment by investigating and addressing cases of misconduct, while providing fair hearing/right of defense to all involved. Students have the right to appeal to the President, IIU against the decision of SDC. The decision of the President, IIU on such appeals is considered as final.

UNFAIR MEANS CONTROL COMMITTEE

An Unfair means control committee exists (UMCC) which is constituted with the approval of the President, on recommendation of the VP (Academics). The members of the committee consist of Four faculty member, Director (Academics and Examination) and officials of Academics & Exams.

Responsibilities of Unfair Means Control Committee:


1. Deal with all the cases reported by the faculties (with supporting documentary evidence) under the misconduct or use of unfair means during the examination.
2. Propose regulations relating to the control of use of unfair means and maintenance of discipline during examination.
3. Decide and recommend penalties as prescribed under the rules and regulations.
4. Call the reporting official to appear before the UMCC as and when required.
5. Appearance before the UMCC is mandatory failure to appear twice shall lead to ex-parte decision.

Following is the list of "unfair means" against which penalties (approved by the competent authority) are imposed:

1. Copying Cases (possession of copying material, copying from fellow student, plagiarism)
2. Cell Phone /Digital Diaries
3. Identity not proved
4. Misconduct
5. Stealing /tearing up/ destroying of Answer sheets
6. Any other

STUDENTS GRIEVANCES COMMITTEE

1. A five-member committee shall be constituted at departmental level with the approval of Vice President (Academics); comprising 02-senior faculty members, relevant Chairperson/In-charge of the department or the dean, to address the grievances of the students. 2. A student shall submit the grievance application (if any) in writing to the Chairperson of the Department. The Chairperson of the Department shall forward the application to the Committee. It will be mandatory for the Committee to hear both sides. The decision/recommendation of the Committee will be approved by the Vice President (Academics) and the final decision will be binding on all the parties.





RE-ADMISSION

- i. Students who will be declared as "PC-2 Ceased" after availing maximum probation chances/ two semesters shall be eligible to apply for Re-admission. Re-admission shall be granted only in the subsequent regular semester after being declared as PC-2 ceased, on recommendation of the Chairperson/Incharge of the relevant department.
- ii. The re-admitted student shall be allotted a new registration number from the semester/date of re-admission.
- iii. On readmission, the student will pay the prescribed admission fee for the program and the fee tariff/rate will be applicable to the student(s) of the semester in which he / she has been readmitted.
- iv. The scheme of studies will be implemented to readmitted students as applicable for the batch he/she has been readmitted. No special classes / courses will be arranged for such cases other than planned classes for repeat courses.
- v. The degree duration of the re-admitted student shall start from the date of his/her readmission.
- vi. Re-admission shall not be allowed more than once in a degree program.
- vii. If a student shall be declared ceased in first semester, he/she will not be eligible for readmission. The student shall seek fresh admission through admission test process.

CLASS TIMINGS

Classes are held from 8.30 a.m. to 8.30 p.m. according to the time table of respective Faculty/Department.

COURSE EXEMPTION /TRANSFER OF CREDITS

Course exemption a) Maximum exemption granted to freshly admitted and readmitted students will be up to 60% (or as prescribed by the relevant Accreditation council) of the passed courses/credit hours. This is subject to the condition that the number of credit hours of such courses does not exceed 60% of the total number of credit hours required for the respective academic program. b) Freshly admitted students shall be entitled to exemption of only those courses passed with a minimum of "B" grade or 70% marks. c) In case of re-admission, all passed preparatory and non-credit courses may be exempted after recommendation of the concerned Chairperson and submission of requisite fee, as prescribed by Fee Section (Finance department). d) Exemption may be granted to the re-admitted undergraduate students of IIUI on the already passed courses of the same level if they passed with a minimum of "C" grade. e) Grades of exempted courses shall be transferred against the new academic record (In case of re-admission only). f) Non-credit courses which are part of scheme of study will be exempted on the basis of language level test. g) The departmental exemption committees shall thoroughly examine the contents of the courses and recommend accordingly. h) Routine course offering shall be followed and no special arrangements shall be made for any student coming from any other institution.

FREEZING OF ADMISSION/SEMESTER

Deferment of admission:

- a. Freezing of the first semester for undergraduate degree programs shall not be allowed except following special hardship circumstances:
 - i. Iddat
 - ii. Maternity/Delivery
 - iii. Death of an immediate family member
 - iv. Unavoidable circumstances, subject to acceptance on justified rationale
2. In such special/hardship cases, the University may allow freezing of admission for one semester only with the prior permission of the Vice President (Academics).
3. Deferment of studies: - On successful completion of 1st semester, the student may seek deferment of studies on prescribed Performa for a maximum period of two semesters (1 year) consecutively or separately on payment of prescribed deferment fee and fulfilment of following conditions:



- i. After two weeks' time and till mid of the semester (i.e., 8th week/ before midterm), 50% of tuition fee shall be deducted and remaining 50% shall be adjusted in the subsequent semester. However, if tuition fee has not been paid till then, 50% tuition fee shall be charged before deferment if deferment is granted. However, deferment shall not be allowed if a student has appeared in the mid-term examination of a semester.
- ii. A student who neither has registered any course nor attended any class, and applies for deferment, he/she will be allowed same on payment of deferment fee only.
- iii. Except deferment, no gap in the degree shall be condoned.
- iv. After availing two deferments, if a gap of a semester is pointed out, the student will be declared "Absent Ceased" and he/she is required to apply for re-admission from that semester.
- v. In case of freezing semester on medical grounds, the student shall be bound to produce medical certificate which must be duly signed by the University Medical Officer.
- vi. Deferment period shall not be counted towards the degree duration.
- vii. Ex-post facto deferment shall be allowed with double deferment fee as per rules.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Students shall be required to abide by the prescribed Rules and Regulations of IIUI and observe the dress code and basic Islamic tenets failing which students a disciplinary action can be initiated as per disciplinary regulations of the university enforced from time to time.

NOTE: Rules and regulations are subject to revision from time to time as and when required by the university authority.

FACILITIES

Computer Labs:

Students at the IIU campuses enjoy a computer friendly environment, apart from access to computer in the labs. Research centers and libraries also have proper computer facilities for students.

Language Laboratories:

IIUI maintains two separate language laboratories for Arabic and English Departments. These laboratories are well equipped with modern techniques of teaching languages to the students of the University. There are well trained teachers who skillfully use the laboratory techniques and supplement classroom teaching in listening and training skills.

Libraries:

IIUI maintains four (04) well equipped Libraries with Internet facilities and access to international data-base and digital libraries. Central Library maintains all important texts and recommended books. Besides, reading material is made available by the Photostat Service Units. In addition, there is a Book Bank on the main Campus of the university lending books to the students on semester basis. The library is continuously updated with the latest editions of relevant books. The library facility is available for students till 10:00 p.m.

Hostels:

IIUI maintains separate hostels for male and female students. However, availability of seat to newly admitted student is not guaranteed owing to availability of limited number of seats.

Medical Care:

IIUI has well equipped separate Medical Centers for male and female students with a team of qualified doctors for free outdoor treatment of minor ailments. Cases of serious nature are referred to Government Hospitals in Islamabad for hospitalization and treatment. IIU has set up a pathological laboratory to conduct various tests. The Medical Centers have three ambulances at their disposal to meet any emergency.

Banking Facility:

Branches of HBL, ABL, and Bank Alfalah have been established at the campus to provide banking facility to the students and staff.

Post Office:

A Post Office has been set up by Pakistan Postal Services at old Campus to facilitate the students and staff of the University.

Sports / Recreation & Academic Competition:

IIU encourages participation of students in co-curricular activities. It provides ample of facilities for indoor and outdoor games for boys as well girls. IIU students actively participate in Inter-University competitions and bring good name to IIU by winning medals, trophies & leading positions in these competitions. A modern Gymnasium has been built for female students at their campus. Coaching facilities have also been made available on both Campuses.
